



## Plagiarism Ten Common Examples

<b>1. Copying</b>	Copying words or ideas from <i>any</i> source (e.g., the internet, a book, an article, another student's work) and presenting them as your own
<b>2. Cutting and pasting</b>	Cutting and pasting words or ideas from multiple sources and presenting the compilation or synthesis as your own
<b>3. Neglect</b>	"Forgetting" to use quotation marks
<b>4. Pseudo-paraphrasing</b>	Paraphrasing the words or ideas of others whilst keeping the essential ordering and/or meaning of the original
<b>5. Deception</b>	Presenting a central or guiding idea derived from the work of another as your own 'big' idea
<b>6. Theft</b>	Presenting as independent, work done in collaboration with others (e.g., another student or a tutor)
<b>7. Fraud</b>	Submitting all or part of another student's work as your own
<b>8. Self-Plagiarism</b>	Submitting the same assignment (more-or-less) for two or more separate assessment tasks
<b>9. Cheating</b>	Using the work of another student or unauthorised notes or aids in an exam
<b>10. Imitation</b>	Using the unique design, artwork, images, or format of another's work without acknowledgment
