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PLAGIARISM - TEN COMMON EXAMPLES

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1. Copying	Copying words or ideas from <i>any</i> source (e.g., the internet, a book, an article, another student's work) and presenting them as your own
2. Cutting and pasting	Cutting and pasting words or ideas from multiple sources and presenting the compilation or synthesis as your own
3. Neglect	"Forgetting" to use quotation marks
4. Pseudo-paraphrasing	Paraphrasing the words or ideas of others whilst keeping the essential ordering and/or meaning of the original
5. Deception	Presenting a central or guiding idea derived from the work of another as your own 'big' idea
6. Theft	Presenting as independent, work done in collaboration with others (e.g., another student or a tutor)
7. Fraud	Submitting all or part of another student's work as your own
8. Self-Plagiarism	Submitting the same assignment (more-or-less) for two or more separate assessment tasks
9. Cheating	Using the work of another student or unauthorised notes or aids in an exam
10. Imitation	Using the unique design, artwork, images, or format of another's work without acknowledgment
